We are ambitious in our quest to support the growth of the game across the continent; not only in widening the reach of the game but also ensure it is played to the highest quality. We know, in doing so, that netball has the power to change lives through better health, building personal skills and bringing communities together

Our Vision

“A netball revolution across Europe”

We are in exciting times for netball. Women and girls' sports participation is growing like never before and our sport is at the sharp end of this. Increased television and on line coverage is bringing the game into people's homes on a daily basis. The 2019 World Cup will bring a world-wide focus and profile for the sport bringing along with it new commercial opportunities. We believe we are genuinely at the start of a “netball revolution” across Europe.

Our Mission (purpose)

“To connect, influence and provide netball to meet the needs of our member countries”

It is not our job to govern the sport as that is for the International Netball Federation and members in their own nations. Rather, we exist to support those nations in their development and operation through providing a vehicle for sharing good practice, being more efficient through joint work and providing European wide competition.

Currently, there are large disparities between the member countries; on the one hand there is Netball England, current Commonwealth Champions with over 100,000 members and a turnover of c£11m in 2017; on the other there are smaller nations whose members are in the hundreds. We know we can't be all things to all nations but we can and will add value to each in a way that is relevant to their needs.



Our Pillars – Participate, Perform and Prosper

Participate

At the heart of the netball revolution will be growing the number of people playing the game.

Several member countries have a range of well-developed programmes and products players at all ages, abilities and backgrounds. We will support the sharing of the learning of these and other innovations to all members in a bid to ensure all members countries strengthen their playing base.

This will involve, for example, supporting members to grow the game in their own countries through sharing development programmes and products

Netball was founded on being a girls and women sport and we will continue to build on this foundation. Not least of which, because we know girls and women's participation in sport generally lags behind those of their male counterparts right across the continent. We want to build and focus on the strengths and traditions that netball offers although that is not to say we won't encourage mixed and men's netball. This is especially the case in emerging member countries where mixed netball is more of the norm.

Participation in our sport though is much more than playing. We need to grow the number of coaches, officials, team managers, administrators, board members, sports scientists, and so on. Some will be paid but the vast majority will be volunteers putting their time and expertise into the sport and in return gain friendships, skills and fun from the sport.

To support this, we again will share the good practice and innovations taking place and, where appropriate, will provide common qualifications and training that are members can make use of.

We organise a range of international tournaments at age group and open levels. They allow top level competition for elite performers whilst gaining international ranking points. Netball Europe appoints all the officials for the events to ensure they are of world class standards.

Our challenge is to ensure our tournaments remain competitive in an environment where our members have hugely different resources at their disposal. Separating “championship” and “Challenger” sections will continue and we will seek more innovative ways to ensure our competitive programme meets all member nations’ needs.

As programmes develop across our member countries we will organise competition in alternative forms of the game such as FAST5, walking netball and netball for those with disability.

Prosper

To collectively inspire the netball revolution, it is vital that all member countries and our own organisations continue to develop and prosper. The bedrock is the highest standards of governance and operation to ensure we can stand up to rightful scrutiny from our members and stakeholders. We will support our members through sharing good practice and organise relevant training where the need arises.

We also need to grow our membership base. That includes supporting our member countries to increase their own playing and workforce base; it also includes carefully considering the expansion of the game into countries currently with no or little netball taking place.



As we enter our next era we recognise our volunteer base is stretched which will restrict progress in our ambitions. By member nations working together we can capitalise on commercial opportunities, especially relating to our tournaments and events. This will require a fresh approach for us with new skills required around our table.
